Featured in the song cycle are four poems written by children who were at Theresienstadt. I am excited to bring this beautiful and moving work to our New Orleans community. Also on the program are pieces by Elgar, Bartók, Handel, and Glück. Phillip Larroque and Maxim Samarov will take turns conducting the New Orleans Chamber Orchestra. From The Executive Director

Welcome Home!

I have been eagerly anticipating and excited to say those words to my Temple Sinai family, as we host Summer Union Shabbat this month. I can't believe how quickly the summer has flown by, and here we are again—ready for a new year of exciting events at Temple Sinai!

We have been very busy at Temple during June and July, preparing for your return. Our Hurricane Ida/FEMA waterproofing project has been underway and is scheduled for completion in September. We have completed the first step of a full pressure—washing of the Sanctuary brick—it's never looked so clean and bright! The brick's mortar is now undergoing tuckpointing—the process of removing the old mortar and replacing it with new mortar. The final step is applying the waterproofing solution. A big thank you to Cliff Kern and Tyler Guidroz from House & Property for their guidance as we undergo this important process in mitigating our hurricane damage.

Our front lobby gates for the St. Charles Ave. and Palmer St. entrances are now fully operational and automated. This project completes our 2022 FEMA Non-profit Security Grant. Upon arrival at Temple Sinai, please announce yourself using the new call box, and our staff will buzz the gates open for you. No need to touch anything or pull the door open. We are grateful this layer of security has been added to our approved security plan. Thank you to Security Committee Chair Lee Bressler for his continued support and leadership. From the President Building Our Legacy Together

Greetings, Temple Sinai!

As many of you know, during this May's annual meeting, I accepted the nomination for President of the Board of Trustees of our historic congregation. Joined by my wife, Jeri Ann, and seven-year-old daughter, Rose, I'm excited to work with our clergy, Jenn, and our Board as we plan, build, and execute our vision for this upcoming year here at Sinai. While I know that there will be many opportunities to get to know one another, I thought that in my first message, I would share a few reflections from a recent road trip.

This past April, Jeri Ann and I took a drive up to West Feliciana Parish, in the small town of St. Francisville. Tucked into the rolling hills (yes, hills) just northwest of Baton Rouge, it's a part of Louisiana that feels wholly unfamiliar to us living here at sea level — think more Hudson Valley than Hessmer Ave. While St. Francisville is best known for its antebellum history and Neo-Classical architecture, what surprised me most was discovering a significant Jewish history that continues to this day.

It began in the late 19th century, when German Jewish immigrants, like many others, arrived seeking a new start. They were drawn to St. Francisville by the promise of opportunity and reinvention in the years following the Civil War. Once they arrived, they quickly established themselves as professionals and civic leaders, helping to shape the town's character—its economy, institutions, and culture. They built community meeting places, a synagogue, and a cemetery, all of which still stand today. While little of the Jewish population remains, absorbed mainly by Baton Rouge and Lafayette, the imprint of their legacy endures in the fond stories that historians tell and the many historical markers along the main thoroughfare that commemorate this community's impressive contributions to civic and communal life.

As I stood before one of those markers, reading names and stories I hadn't heard before, I reflected on the way that Jewish life, when cultivated with commitment and intention, has always found a way to take root and thrive, even in places we don't expect. Those early families of St. Francisville didn't just settle; through their commitments, they built a thriving community that continues to affect future generations. As I think about what I want to work on over the next two years as our Temple President, I find myself reflecting deeply about this idea of legacy — and how we create permanence for future generations by contributing in earnest to this one.

For me, service to my city, the legal profession, my community, and this congregation are my outward expressions of that commitment. 

Brotherhood News




